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Codebook

These lists of codes are derived from the codes used in the study of the *agenda-setting leadership* and *public leadership* of the European Commission presidents, conducted between January 2013 and October 2015.

The content analyses of the political speeches and newspaper articles (*Financial Times*) were conducted with the data analysis software MAXQDA. One speech or article may have addressed more than one topic, but each topic was only coded once in a speech.

The speeches have been collected from the following archives: Federal Archive of Germany (Koblenz), Historical Archives of the European Commission (Brussels), Historical Archives of the European Union (Florence), as well as from the European Commission's online archives (for further details, please see references).

The newspaper articles of the *Financial Times* have been collected from the *Financial Times*' digital archive and the *LexisNexis* database.

4a) Agenda-Setting Leadership

The analysis of the presidents' speeches is guided by a set of eight higher-level categories, encompassing both topics and venues, that allow for a comparison across the process of European integration.

1. Main Topics/Political Agenda

Refers to those topics and issue clusters the president predominantly addressed, and as such formed his political agenda. The crucial characteristic of the main topics category is frequency, that is, how often the given president addressed the respective issues while in office.

2. Major Political Internal/External Events

Refers to the president's response to important events that occurred during his tenure at the European level or that were of central importance to the process of European integration. Internal events encompass, for example, accession rounds of new member states and EEC/EC/EU treaty reforms, as well as institutional or economic crises that had an impact on the further development of European integration, such as the Empty Chair crisis and the European financial and sovereign debt crisis. External events are international developments such as the Cold War, the fall of the Berlin Wall, the Gulf crisis, or the process of globalization more broadly.

3. EEC/EC/EU General Issues

Refers to all general political topics and issue clusters discussed by the president and related to EEC, EC, or EU politics respectively.

4. EEC/EC/EU Policies

Comprises all concrete policies or policy initiatives discussed at length in any speech.

5. EEC/EC/EU Institutions

Encompasses all institutions within the European institutional framework ranging from the European Parliament to the European Council. This category focuses on the central arenas at the European level, in which the Commission president announces his agenda and where it is potentially negotiated and implemented.

6. National Governmental Institutions

Encompasses institutions at the national level, such as governments, parliaments, and ministries of both EEC/EC/EU member states and non-member states. This category gives insight into what extent the incumbent invested in national alliance and consensus building. Moreover, it shows to what extent the Commission president met with representatives of non-member states, such as accession candidates or powerful partners, such as the US, China, or Russia.

7. International Conferences

Comprises all international occasions in which the respective president delivered a speech, such as UN or G8 summits.

8. Civil Society Organizations/Advocacy Groups

Encompasses all interest and lobby groups, academic institutions, trade unions, foundations, and political or faith-based organizations within EEC/EC/EU member states that are not directly involved in governmental tasks, whether at the regional, national, or European and international level.

4b) Public Leadership

The analysis of the *Financial Times*' articles is guided by a set of five higher-level categories, encompassing both the newspaper's perception and its actual coverage of the agenda setting of the respective Commission president, that allow for a comparison across the process of European integration.

To ensure a clear indication that a particular president was in fact covered in a given article, the search terms encompassed mentions of "Hallstein," "Delors," and "Barroso" in either headlines or subtitles during their respective tenures.

1. FT Coverage of Commission President's Main Topics/Political Agenda

Refers to all those topics by the respective Commission president that have been coded as a main topic/political agenda in the agenda-setting analysis. The aim here is to uncover to what extent the newspaper reported on the president's main topics.

2. FT Coverage of Commission President's EEC/EC/EU General Issues

Refers to all those topics by the respective Commission president that have been coded as EEC/EC/EU general issues in the agenda-setting analysis. The aim here is to uncover to what extent the newspaper reported on the president's EEC/EC/EU general issues.

3. FT Coverage of Commission President's EEC/EC/EU Policies

Refers to all those topics by the respective Commission president that have been coded as EEC/EC/EU policies in the agenda-setting analysis. The aim here is to uncover to what extent the newspaper reported on the president's EEC/EC/EU policies.

4. FT Coverage Apart from a President's Agenda

Refers to all those aspects within an article that do not directly relate to the president's agenda, e.g., a president's leadership style.

5. FT Perception of Commission President

This category aims to uncover the newspaper's perception of the respective Commission president. The coding consists of "positive," "neutral," and "negative" evaluations. Positive reporting applies when the article directly or indirectly praises and supports the Commission president's agenda, presidency, actions, or leadership style. Negative coverage applies when the article in any way directly or indirectly criticizes the president's agenda, presidency, actions, or leadership style. Neutral reporting refers to those articles that neither offer any direct or indirect indication whether they support or are critical of the

president's agenda, presidency, actions, or leadership style. Articles offering mixed coverage, with both positive and negative reporting, are coded in both of those categories.
